Parking Problems

Early Morning

If for any reason you need to bring your child in any earlier you will need to supervise them yourself until a teacher is present, unless you have made specific arrangements with your Class Teacher. If it is raining, then parents are welcome to drop their children to the door by the Towan cloakroom that leads into the library from the playground, but no earlier than 8.30am please. The children can hang up their belongings and then make their way to the classrooms where there will be an adult present, and wait for registration.
