Dear Parents

This week we have received the latest guidance on the full reopening of school to all children in September. This weekend I will be digesting the guidance and start to build or plans.

We are confident at this stage that we will be able to meet the guidance and accommodate all pupils but of course, there are many things to consider. Here is a link to the guidance:

What we do know now is that the school will be open to all and that all children will need to be in school uniform, uniform orders can be processed quickly in most cases, but to avoid any delay we suggest you consider placing orders sooner to ensure that the shop is able to meet your needs. Below is a reminder of our uniform expectations – please do consider the need to have an outdoor PE kit as all classes will be having outdoor PE sessions from September.

School Uniform

Our uniform is a mark of the school's collective identity. We ask that all children adhere to the uniform requirements every day.

Kehelland Village School Uniform

Navy blue sweatshirt with school logo – jumpers without the logo are acceptable.

Blue (Enys), Yellow (Porth) or Green (Towan) polo shirt

Black trousers, skirt, shorts or a pinafore dress.

Black flat shoes

The school would prefer the children to wear polo shirts and shorts or skirts during warmer months. However, where girls would like to wear summer dresses, a gingham dress in the appropriate house colour (blue, yellow or green) is permissible during the summer term, with a navy blue school cardigan. We are happy to meet pupil's individual uniform needs. Please ask to talk to the School SENDCo to agree to any changes your child may need. Other than agreed reasonable adjustments, all children are expected to be in full uniform each day.

Health and Safety

Safe and sensible footwear is essential at all times, therefore school shoes should be plain black and flat.

All children need a coat or waterproof in school throughout the year.

We require all hair of shoulder length to be tied back to ensure that it is not falling onto the shoulders. This should be done to the back to make sure each child can safely take part in active playtimes and PE lessons.

No jewellery (other than plain studs for pierced ears and watches) is acceptable.

We do not regard tattoo transfers as appropriate in school.

We encourage the use of sun hats or warm winter headgear and indeed, we recommend both as appropriate for outdoor PE sessions.

Blue (Enys), Yellow (Porth) or Green (Towan) t-shirt
Black shorts
Trainers (football boots plus shin-pads for those attending football or rugby club)
A change of socks
Navy blue track-suit trousers can also be worn when cold.
Pupils should ensure that all of this kit is in school throughout the week.
