September:

We are still in the process of putting together plans for next year. The guidance document can be found here. <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools>

On Monday I have a visit from the Director of Education to look at our plans and agree if we are taking the right steps forward. I will be in a position to finally share our plans after this visit.

Currently, we are working on a class – bubble – model whereby each class will form its own bubble to work within. We will be trying to mix our bubbles as little as possible and so some aspects of school life will be different.

One of the biggest changes for families will be the need to maintain a clean site in the morning. To support us, parents will be asked not to access the school building. Once the gates are open, at your child's drop off time, we will be asking parents to walk through the school grounds and for the child to walk into school. Staff will be on hand to support and supervise. If your child is unsure we will be asking that Parents walk around the playground – using the court as a guide to maintain

We will not be lining up before we enter and we will be offering slightly staggered start times to support drop off. Families with more than one child will be able to drop them off at the same time. For the first term at least we will not be able to have our Godrevy group registrations and all children will go straight to their own class, be met by staff and register straight away.

Playtimes and lunchtimes will also be staggered to enable us to have fewer children in the playground at the same time and similarly in the hall.

We will not be holding whole school assemblies, but class assemblies will take the place of these events.

I hope to expand on this and give you the drop off time details you need in the early part of next week.
