I would be most grateful if parents could keep these dates in mind when planning any holidays or short breaks away. Thank you.



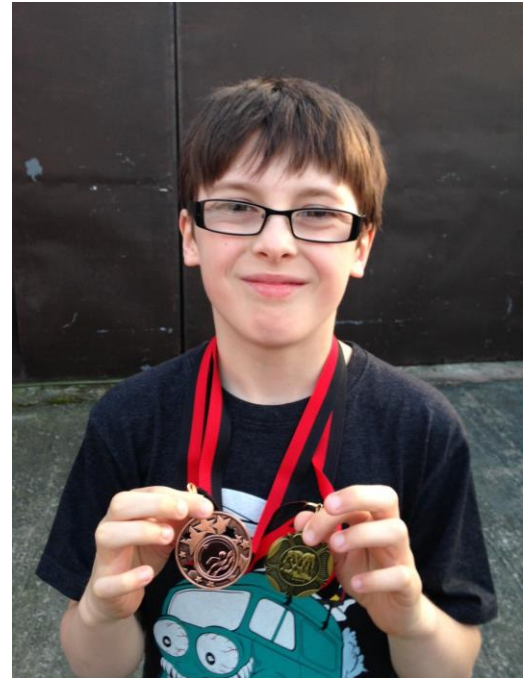
## Achievements
