Please note that tomorrow – Friday – is an INSET day so the school will be closed to pupils in order to give the teaching staff time to plan together for the next half term.


I would like to take this opportunity of wishing everyone a lovely half term break and let's keep our fingers crossed that Storm Eunice doesn't do too much damage!!






